Dear Mr. Harmer:

I have just written a letter to the lodge thanking them for their contribution toward the News Letter. I am sure that the men appreciate any interest that we on the Home Front show in the building of morale on the Fighting Front.

I will have a note in the next issue telling of the contribution but I decided that it should not be up at the front <sup>of the News Letter</sup> as we have a campus organization, as we have always had, sponsoring and mailing the October 1st issue and since there are so many individuals who also have contributed.

You see, one pilot from the South Pacific sent \$25.00, a civilian sent \$25.00 also, and a great many individuals have given \$10.00 each. A good many of them have asked that their gifts remain unannounced so we have in general followed that line.

This is the first contribution from an outside organization that is being acknowledged in the News Letter. I, myself, have always favored the individual contributions and those especially from acquaintances of the men. Those people like to sit down and read the whole News Letter and that personal interest gives me a great deal of personal satisfaction.

With the new postage arrangement that the Post Office requires, each issue will cost us at least \$150.00, and that is a goodly sum. I shall soon have copies for you to distribute at the lodge.
